

The Session held its monthly meeting on December 18, a week later than usual thanks to the recent snow storm. The meeting was opened with a devotional presented by Pamela Campbell. She reminded those present that we can find the hand of God in many aspects of our lives, but if we are not paying attention we can miss it.

The Session rejoiced in the coming of Barry and Linda Stokes, and Katharine DiOrio as the newest members of Trinity. They also remembered the life of Sarah Gilbert who passed away on December 2, 2018.

Mark and Dwight reported on their actions in support of the life and ministry of Trinity. The Advent and Christmas Seasons are always particularly demanding upon them. Dwight highlighted that later in the week Trinity would be holding its first "Blue Christmas" service, in recognition that there may be aspects of the Christmas time that are not particularly joyous for some folks. It is hoped that this service will bring peace and comfort.

Tom Karvonen reported that, as of the meeting \$82,221 had been pledged by 120 people toward the installation of solar panels on the roof of the church. The contract has been signed with the vendor, and the application for the Duke rebate will be filed in January 2019. Work will begin in early 2019.

Finance and Stewardship Ministry presented the proposed 2019 Budget. Following a discussion, the 2019 Budget was approved by Session. The details of the budget will be presented at the Annual Congregational meeting to be held on Sunday, January 20, 2019, during the Learning Hour.

Session was pleased to hear the faith journey stories of newly elected Session members Kathryn Forsythe and Jeffrey Sheffield. They were both approved for ordination. The ordination and installation of new Session members will take place at both services on January 6, 2019.

Finance and Stewardship Ministry reported that through November 2018 estimate of giving receipts are below expectations and the net income is a negative \$20,209. It is hoped that end of year giving will help to close that gap.

Session elected Kathryn Forsythe to be the Clerk of Session in 2019.

Let me take a moment to thank all who have helped and supported me over the past few years as I served in the role of Clerk of Session. I am pleased that I have been able to serve Trinity in this capacity, and I know that we will be in good hands as Kathryn assumes that role.


