

The ever insightful writer/theologian Frederick Buechner says the following about "JOY":

"In the Gospel of John, Jesus sums up pretty much everything by saying, 'These things I have spoken to you that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.' (John 15:11) He said it at the supper that he knew was the last one he'd have a mouth to eat.

Happiness turns up more or less where you'd expect it to- a good marriage, a rewarding job, a pleasant vacation. Joy, on the other hand is as notoriously unpredictable as the one who bequeathes it." (Wishful Thinking: A Theological ABC, 1973)

I relate these thoughts as we enter the, "season of joy." I suspect that when (and if) we experience joy it will sneak up on us unannounced, probably catching us off guard. The season of Advent is a time of "watching and waiting." As you are engaged in this process, be on the lookout for JOY!

# 70½ or Beyond? Have an IRA? Here is a Giving Opportunity Unique to You

Federal government action has made IRA Charitable Rollovers a permanent part of the tax code. As such, individuals who are ages 70½ or older may make donations from their IRAs (by their IRA trustee) *directly* to Trinity Presbyterian Church *without having to count the distribution as taxable income*. This donation would be classified as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (OCD).

A part, or all, of this donation can count toward your IRA Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). There are specific legal requirements that must be met.

One of the significant changes in the tax code beginning this year makes it more difficult to itemize deductions. This will make the QCDs more popular by not having to include them in taxable income.

Always consult your own financial and tax advisors before making any gift that has tax implications. State law, particularly in North Carolina, does not always treat Qualified Charitable Distributions in the way the Federal Government does.



# **SESSION NOTES**

The Session held its regular meeting on November 13, 2018. The Session rejoiced in the coming of Andy and Leslie Nissen as affiliate members. Their full time membership remains with the Isle of Hope UMC, Savannah GA. The Session also noted the passing of Bill Garrison on October 17, 2018.

Dwight provided a written report of his primary activities for the past month. Much of his time was focused on planning the Advent services and other related activities at the church. Dwight also reported on his involvement in the Community Organizing and Congregational Leadership Training Program. This involved attendance at the initial session, and will include ongoing video meetings, and reading and writing assignments. Dwight described how he plans to use this training in developing future programs at Trinity.

Mark also provided a written report on his activities. He noted that the HCCU cooperative organization is no longer meeting. Therefore, there is no planned joint Thanksgiving service in which TPC has participated in the past. Mark also announced that Taqunia Collins, Habitat coordinator, was killed in an accident near Traveler's Rest, SC on Route 25. As a result the Dedication Ceremony for this year's Faith Build will be postponed.

Tom Karvonen made a presentation on the status of the solar panel project. So far we have 68 donations and pledges. As a result, the committee is moving forward with negotiations with contractors. It is expected that a contract will be awarded in the near future, and work can commence.

Tom also provided the Session with the status of the 2019 Budget preparation. There are a few more details to be worked out, and a final proposal should be presented to Session in December. Jim Smelker provided an update of the Stewardship Program for 2019. It is hoped that some additional pledges will be received in the near future, and that we will have sufficient funds to meet our 2019 needs.

Fitz Sthreshley, Treasurer, reported that through October we are operating favorably relative to the 2018 Budget. With the usual December giving pattern, we should end the year in a positive situation.

# Presbytery of WNC Delegation to Malawi Two Possible Dates May 17-May 31, 2019 June 14-28, 2019

Trinity and the Presbytery of WNC are happy to be a part of and support the work in Malawi. **Would you like to be part of this years delegation** that plans to visit Malawi, Ebenezar Hospital and other areas of work being supported by the Presbyterian Church USA?

A typical trip is a two-week *service opportunity* as we work alongside our friends at Nkhoma Hospital, Ebenezer School, and the Nkoma Synod. While we do engage in service projects, our main focus is forming and maintaining relationships with our partners in Malawi.

#### What will we do?

- Broaden our understanding of our brothers and sisters in another part of the world and bring us closer to each other;
- Take Christ's love there and bring it back;
- Provide opportunity for the Malawians and us to learn from the strengths of our faith in each culture, and to help us come more into balance, moving closer to the abundant life;
- Raise support for the ministries related to our denomination in Malawi.

# What is the cost?

The cost will be \$3,000, excluding personal preparation expenses (passport, immunizations, medicines, etc.). There may be scholarship help.
